# FREIGHTING OF MOTOR VEHICLES

# Central Australia Railway

Passengers who so desire may arrange to have their motor vehicles conveyed over the Central Australia Railway, to and from Alice Springs,

At least seven (7) days notice should be given to any one of the undermentioned officials of desire to rail motor vehicles:—

Secretary, Commonwealth Railways, 623 Collins Street, Melbourne (Telephone 62 3551).

Commonwealth Railways Representative, Railway Station, Adelaide (Telephone 51 6269).

Commonwealth Railways Representative, Room 6, First Floor, Padbury Buildings, Forrest Place, Perth (Telephone 23 4918).

Chief Traffic Manager, Commonwealth Railways, Port Augusta (Telephone 2253).

Stationmaster, Railway Station, Alice Springs (Telephone 17).

In special circumstances, consideration will be given to the acceptance of vehicles within the period of seven days mentioned above.

The usual procedure for railing motor vehicles over the Central Australia Railway is for passengers to drive to or from Port Augusta (approximately 200 miles from Adelaide), although cars will also be accepted for conveyance between Marree and Alice Springs

Cars are required for loading at Port Augusta before 9 a.m. on the day of travel, or at Marree at 4 p.m. on the day of travel, and are available at Alice Springs on the day of arrival.

In the southbound direction, cars are required for loading at Alice Springs, before 1 p.m. on the day preceding the day of travel, and are available at either Marree or Port Augusta on the day of arrival.

There is no limit on the amount of petrol which may be left in the tank of a passenger's motor vehicle for conveyance over the Central Australia Railway.

Passengers are permitted to leave a reasonable amount of luggage in vehicles whilst in transit. It should, of course, be noted that any luggage left in a vehicle would be conveyed under Owner's Risk conditions of carriage.

Motor vehicles for conveyance over the Central Australia Railway are generally loaded and unloaded as follows:

### FREIGHT RATES

A concession in freight rates is allowed on motor cars, utilities, panel vans and station wagons, provided that the equivalent of two adult first class or three adult second class fares is paid for the same journey as the motor vehicle.

Concession rates are not available on trailers or caravans, which are regarded as separate vehicles for the calculation of freight rates.

# GENERAL INFORMATION

Rail accommodation for **forward journeys** may be booked twelve calendar months in advance.

**Return** rail accommodation may be booked by passengers purchasing return tickets, up to thirteen calendar months in advance.

### AVAILABILITY OF TICKETS

Ordinary tickets between Adelaide, Port Pirie Junction, Port Augusta, and Marree and Alice Springs:

Single Tickets — 14 days Return Tickets — 2 months.

Ordinary inter-system tickets between other systems: Single tickets between adjoining Systems, one month. Single tickets between three or more Systems, three months

Return tickets are available for six months.

Break of journey is permitted at any station, provided the journey to destination is completed within the periods above mentioned.

### LUGGAGE

### Free Allowance

Passengers undertaking journeys between capital cities—

1st Class, 168 lb. 2nd Class, 112 lb.
Passengers undertaking journeys other than between capital cities—

1st Class, 112 lb. 2nd Class, 84 lb.

# Luggage Checks

Passengers may "check" their luggage between any of the places at which inter-system rail tickets are on issue.

As the space available for luggage in sleeping compartments is necessarily limited, passengers are recommended to take with them in the compartment one suitcase not exceeding 28 inches in length which can be placed in the rack provided for this purpose and one smaller case (say 14-16 inches).

Other luggage should be "checked through" in the brakevan.

A similar position exists in the southbound direction, e.g., passengers from Alice Springs to Melbourne who arrive in Adelaide at 5.20 p.m. on Thursdays may proceed to Melbourne by the 7.10 p.m. Overland from Adelaide the same evening.

# **CENTRAL AUSTRALIA**

Central Australia with its perfect winter climate and its variety of scenic attractions is now one of Australia's most popular winter tourist resorts.

Alice Springs, the terminus of the Central Australia Railway, is situated in the Macdonnell Ranges, 2,000 feet above sea level. On the same degree of latitude as Rockhampton (Queensland), Alice Springs enjoys perfect weather during the months of May, June, July and August, when the Southern States are experiencing the rigours of winter.

Regular tours connecting with the Central Australia Railway train service at Alice Springs are now arranged to most of the beauty spots throughout this area.

Further enquiries concerning these tours should be directed to Tourist Bureaux. The following is a brief description of some of the delightful scenic attractions of Central Australia.



### AYERS ROCK

Ayers Rock, measuring five and one half miles around its base, and rising a sheer 1,150 feet from the surrounding desert, is the greatest monolith in the world. It is 240 miles south-west of Alice Springs. Numerous caves and rock paintings are to be found at Avers Rock.



### PALM VALLEY

This delightful oasis, situated 100 miles west of Alice Springs, is one of the most interesting and picturesque spots in Australia. Here the vegetation and flora of long ago are still to be found. Cycads and the famous Livistonia marioe palms abound.



# STANDLEY CHASM

Situated 34 miles from Alice Springs, Standley Chasm is one of the most remarkable gaps in the romantic heart of Australia. The walls which rise to a height of 100 feet, and are not more than 15 feet apart, are a riot of colour. Bright yellows and burnt sienna, streaked and splashed with brown and black. form the predominating scene.

A variety of other unrivalled beauty spots are also within easy reach of Alice Springs-Simpson's Gap. Emily Gap with its carvings, Gall Spring and Glen Helen Gorge, are but a few of the delightful attractions that await the traveller in the magnetic heart of the continent.
